Intro to Wild Bunch Shooting

SASS Wild Bunch shooting originated and inspired from the 1969 Movie "The Wild Bunch"

directed by Sam Peckinpah.

SASS Wild Bunch sport utilizes three guns to shoot each stage. John Browning designed 1911 full size, 45 ACP pistol and 1897 Winchester, Model 12, 12 ga shotgun with magazine tube hold up to 6 rounds, and rifle in 40 caliber and larger, i.e., 44-40, 45 long colt, and 45 ACP calibers.

Whiskey Row Wild Bunch is a 5 stage Monthly Match includes:

Up to 150 rounds of 45 ACP, minimum 180 grain round nose lead bullet

Up to 50 rounds of minimum 40 caliber, minimum 180 grain flat point lead bullet

Up to 30 rounds of 12 ga shotgun, with #6 shot or smaller

SASS matches usually incorporate lateral movement, stand, and shoot from each prop. There are many different scenarios and to shoot the many different targets, i.e., pistol, rifle, shotgun during each stage. Examples of different targets are circle and square steel, lateral and vertical plate racks, bell, and knockdown, etc.
